# **Clinical Supervision Resources**

The <u>APA Guidelines for Clinical Supervision in Health Service Psychology</u> describe practices in seven domains for psychologists who supervise trainees or students. The guidelines provide information in the following domains:

- 1. Supervisor competence
- 2. Diversity
- 3. Supervisory relationships
- 4. Professional behavior and upholding ethical standards
- 5. Providing feedback and assessment and evaluation
- 6. Professional competence/performance
- 7. Adhering to ethical and legal/regulatory guidelines.

The APA's Guidelines on Trauma Competencies were created to guide education and training within the US and psychologists' self-monitoring. The guidelines consist of five broad trauma competencies and nine cross-cutting competencies. The trauma guidelines can serve as a foundation for training a trauma-informed mental health workforce.
